## List of activities required for completion of pre-clinical practice:

Pre-clinical work with animals includes:

- Auxiliary work in veterinary surgeries, clinics and field veterinary practice focused on working with animals such as:
  - Fixation and handling of animals
  - Admission, registration and care of examined and hospitalized patients (feeding, walking, cleaning animals)
  - Assistance in performing the work done by veterinary technician or veterinary nurse
  - Work leading to becoming familiar with the work and management of veterinary practice
  - Auxiliary work performed directly in the field conditions of breeding institutions
- Work associated with the care of animals in shelters, zoos and other relevant institutions
- Work in laboratories focused on the examination of animal samples or food of animal origin
- Work in food establishments focused on the production of products of animal origin
- Work associated with the care of animals in animal breeding (large-scale breeding) institutions, including getting to know the technologies related to their breeding
- Active participation in events held in cooperation with breeding clubs, organizations, associations and unions of breeders of farm and companion animals
- Membership and active work in hobby clubs, breeding institutions and associations focused on the breeding and care of animals associated with:
  - Active participation in the organization and preparation of animals for exhibitions, assistance in their demonstration and bonitation
  - Active participation in demonstrations and sporting events focused on cynological and hippological activities, including training, competitions, tests and bonitation (e.g. equestrian competitions, work in cynological clubs focused on sports, hunting, police, rescue cynology, etc.)
